

Dr. Kevin Hicks: A Friend to the Forest

Throughout his long career at the US Department of Agriculture, Dr. Kevin Hicks spent many hours in the lab working on biofuels and later developing product solutions for the dairy industry. Now retired, Hicks channels that same drive, scientific acumen, and dedication to the care of trees—specifically the roughly 200 wooded acres at Lundale Farm outside of Pottstown, Pa.

“I was solving problems in the lab, and now I’m solving problems on a farm,” laughs Hicks.

The Chester County Commissioners and Ag Council gave Hicks of Malvern, Pa., the Duncan Allison Award for Distinguished Service to Agriculture for his volunteer work promoting sustainable forestry practices and invasive species removal, and for serving as a guide for others who own or manage large tracts of land.

Hicks and his wife Pam, a fellow board member at Lundale, work hand-in-hand with Lundale’s leadership and tenant farmers to make sure actions taken on behalf of the forest are a good fit for the nonprofit’s organic, regenerative farming focus. The organization is home to a community of small farms raising livestock for meat and eggs as well as fresh produce. This has meant Hicks has needed to explore organic options and extensive hand labor to control invasive plant species instead of using more effective but chemically intensive means.

Hicks contends that the biggest question a landowner faces is what happens if they choose to do nothing to manage their woodlands.

“A hundred or even 50 years ago, nature would have taken its course,” says Hicks. “Chester County is now at the edge of the storm front, dealing with a huge amount and number of invasive species coming in on shipping materials from our nearby ports, things like lanternflies, oriental bittersweet, multiflora rose, stilt grass, and emerald ash borers.”

As the board chair of Lundale’s Sustainable Forestry Committee, Hicks appreciates that he and Pam can’t do the job alone. A big part of his work involves welcoming and shepherding groups of volunteers to implement Lundale’s forest management plan, as well as applying for grants to make the work possible.

Part of this teamwork approach has also involved hiring a professional forester to selectively log trees, a project Hicks managed in several areas of the property containing dead or diseased ash and poplar trees. This not only opened the tree canopy for younger trees to receive light, but the sale of the logs helped fund additional work on the property. In tandem with these timbering activities, volunteers and hired help have been hard at work replanting with less susceptible tree species for greater forest diversity and hardiness, helping to ensure a bright (green) future for Lundale’s rolling hills.

“Dr. Hicks is a wonderful ambassador for sustainable forestry. He cares deeply for the environment, a true role model for what’s possible in Chester County’s forested acres and beyond,” says Ag Council Interim Director Ann Lane.

INVASIVE SPECIES MANAGEMENT TIPS FOR YOUR HOME

You may not have hundreds of acres to manage but invasive species are a problem for all landowners. According to Pennsylvania’s Department of Natural Resources, invasive plants are those that are not native to an area, spread quickly and can cause economic or environmental harm, or harm to human health. What can you do to help limit their spread in your community?

- **Plant natives.** By keeping a native healthy ecosystem on your property, invasives will have less opportunity to invade.
- **Minimize ground disturbance.** Invasive plants thrive on bare soil when native plants have been displaced.
- **Use fertilizers wisely.** How much fertilizer do you really need? You might be giving invasives an advantage by over-fertilizing.
- **Know your property.** Check your property often, know what is “normal” and what isn’t. Monitoring can help find problem species before they take hold.
- **Act fast.** Treat invasive populations when they are still small and easily controllable. Do not let invasive plants go to seed.

Down to Earth Harvest: Eating Local Made Easy

West Bradford Township



Down to Earth Harvest farmer Robert Todd fondly recalls how parents from a local Boy Scout Troop reacted watching their children snacking on fresh peppers during a recent visit. “The parents were like ‘that can’t be my son, he doesn’t like vegetables,’” he laughs.

Todd is making a business of changing people’s minds about how easy and delicious eating local can be. His Downingtown-based farm operates on a CSA (community supported agriculture) model where customers pay in advance for shares (aka boxes or bags) of produce they receive during the growing season. Todd prefers to describe Down to Earth Harvest as more of a “modern farmstand” concept thanks to flexible online ordering and payment plans which are popular with his customer base of busy families.

“There’s no risk of endless kale when you join our program,” says Todd. “Our members are amazed at how much fun family dinners can be. Veggie pick-up day is suddenly their favorite day of the week, and they’re excited to cook new recipes.”

Inspired by the works of Elliott Coleman and Jean-Martin Fortier on how to farm profitably on small acreage, Todd operates Down to Earth Harvest on only 1.5 acres on the site of a former horse farm in Downingtown. From day one, he focused on building up the soil using no-till, regenerative growing methods incorporating compost made on site plus

compost delivered from Laurel Valley Soils, a Landenberg-based mushroom compost and soil company.

As a small operation with two additional staff plus wife Amy who serves as the CSA coordinator, Todd focuses on growing high value crops his customers love that also do well with the farm’s growing conditions. Broccolini (snack size broccoli), cucumbers, cherry tomatoes, peppers, and carrots are perennial favorites.



“We want to make it easy for families to make healthy choices,” says Todd, a parent to three young children. “Amy and I understand the effort it takes to bring together a wholesome dinner every night. Sometimes the trick to get our family to eat better is as simple as setting out a bowl of fresh veggies and putting the chips on a higher shelf.”

Todd also appreciates that customers want more variety than he and his team can grow on their relatively small plot. He has built a network of relationships with other small, family farms to achieve the thirty plus farm product

selections in Down to Earth Harvest’s online store each week. This means he and his team can focus on the crops they grow best while customers are able to enjoy additional fresh offerings like strawberries, melons, peaches, apples, and mushrooms, all while helping to support a larger community of local farmers.

“We want you to choose our produce because it tastes good,” says Todd. “Our members tell us that flavor and ease of purchase matter most to them. We appreciate that as a busy family, too.”



WHAT IS A CSA (COMMUNITY SUPPORTED AGRICULTURE)?

When you join a CSA program, you pay a farmer upfront for products like vegetables, fruits, meats—even wine and cheese—that you receive at regular intervals during the growing season, most often weekly. Some farms have specific on-farm pick-up times while others offer a wide range of pick-up locations and times.

Joining a CSA program means lots of fresh variety, culinary adventures, and a strong connection to your local food system. For farmers, the model provides income in advance to buy seed and other inputs needed to start the growing season. It’s a great way to support local farmers and take mealtime to the next level.

Farmers of the Year:

The Miller Family of Birchrun Hills Farm

West Vincent Township, PA



“We love connecting people with their food,” says Sue Miller of Birchrun Hills Farm in Chester Springs, Pa. “We want our customers and neighbors to get to know us, see how we raise our cows, and truly appreciate where their food comes from.”

The Chester County Commissioners presented Sue, her husband Ken and sons Randy and Jesse with the 2023 Chester County Farmers of the Year award in an on-farm ceremony in October. The Miller family was recognized for their dynamic business model, commitment to sustainable farming practices, and local food system advocacy—not to mention their award-winning cheeses like their celebrated Birchrun Blue, Red Cat and Equinox varieties.

First generation dairy farmers Ken and Sue Miller started farming in the 1980’s when Chester County farmland was plentiful to lease and milk prices were strong. After enduring years of volatile milk prices and rising land costs, they took a chance on cheesemaking in 2006 to secure a more stable future.

“We knew that we needed to do something different. That we should use the beautiful milk our cows were producing and add value to that milk through cheesemaking,” says Sue.

Sue credits support from PASA (Pennsylvania Association for Sustainable Agriculture), cheesemaking mentor Peter Dixon of Parish Hill Creamery and Westminster Artisan Cheesemaking in Vermont, and Di Bruno Brothers gourmet shops in Philadelphia for helping her learn the art and science of cheese production. They encouraged her to create cheeses unique to Birchrun Hills and not worry about industry trends.

Ken, an early adopter of no till and cover cropping practices, oversees the crop management side of the business using sustainable farming practices to grow feed for their 80-cow Holstein herd. He is forever mindful of the watershed his family stewards and how the quality of the land and water is reflected in the flavors of cheese they produce. “Chester County has some of the best non-irrigated soils in the world, we should never take that for granted,” he says.

Sons Randy and Jesse handle herd management and the sales and marketing aspects of the family’s business respectively. Both graduated from Cornell University’s animal sciences program which they credit for affirming their choice to return to their family’s farm. “The Dairy Fellows program at Cornell University allowed us to tour

and study many diverse dairy businesses in the northeast and has been immensely influential in our decision-making for our business” says Randy.

With Randy and Jesse working full time at the farm, the family has been able to expand their reach into new markets. Their cheeses have developed a passionate following of chefs, food critics, and specialty retailers across the region. Cheese enthusiasts can also find them at the Phoenixville, Bryn Mawr, Kennett Square, Royersford, Fairmount, Northern Liberties and Headhouse farmers markets and at their newly opened farm store in Chester Springs.

The Millers have also started hosting a weekly on-farm happy hour each Friday with neighboring Le Garage Winery. Aply named “The Cheesiest Happy Hour”

the tagline is “come for wine and cheese, stay for cows and conversation.” Visitors can sip a glass of wine while enjoying house curated “grazing boards” featuring Birchrun cheeses and locally produced accompaniments, all while listening to live music and catching up with friends.

“When people come to our farm, we want them to feel connected to agriculture. We want to build community. We want to be their farmers,” says Sue.

What would the Miller family like to see more of in the future?

“We’d like to encourage more people to shop locally and include more local cheese for their everyday table, not just special occasions,” says Sue. “Cheese makes people slow down and enjoy life.”

SUE MILLER’S CHEESE IDEAS FOR EVERYDAY

Breakfast—Try fromage blanc instead of cream cheese on your bagel. Fromage blanc is a fresh cheese that is bright, tangy, milky and makes an excellent spread.

Lunch—Assemble a “ploughman’s lunch.” This traditional English style meal is based around cheese, cured meats and sausages, rustic bread, pickled veggies, and fruit. Serve with ease on a cheese board. Quick and easy.

Dinner—If you have company coming, serve baked brie wrapped in puff pastry with a local jam. On a busy night, add feta or blue cheese to your salad to make it extra special. Melt your favorite local cheese on burgers.

The Acadian Wine Company: A New Take on an Old Tradition

West Grove, PA



“Wine is as complicated as you want to make it,” says Kyle Jones, owner and winemaker of The Acadian Wine Company in West Grove, Pa. “Wine is the pure expression of where it is grown and the time in which it was made. It’s a product of the rocks and soil, the position of the vines facing the sun, the slope of the land, and the effect of the wind on the vineyard. But it can also just be about making memories with friends and family while sharing a bottle of something good on the porch.”

The eight-acre vineyard and winery, originally known as Kreutz Creek Winery, was founded in 1997 by the Kirkpatrick family who went on to run it for 25 years. Jones met the family while consulting as a winemaker for nearby Paradox Winery. On a visit to the property to look at some machinery for sale, he fell in love with its gentle rolling hills and onsite winemaking facility.

After purchasing Kreutz Creek from the Kirkpatricks when they retired in February of 2022, he chose to rename it The Acadian Wine Company in honor of his Acadian and French heritage. “It’s a subtle way to share my connection with the wine and my place in the larger winemaking tradition.”

Jones and his hard-working team of family and friends have since planted over a thousand new grape vines to replace older damaged stock and reinvigorate the remaining three acres vineyard. They’ve also made big changes to the overall ambiance and guest experience. The Kirkpatrick’s former home, originally constructed to operate as a bed and breakfast, has been transformed into a lively tasting room, local art gallery, and event space able to seat up to 60 people.

The winery is part of Brandywine Wine Trail, a regional association of wine and cider producers dedicated to the promotion and preservation of the Brandywine Valley as a unique and outstanding wine-producing region. Accordingly, hospitality and gentle wine education are key components of Jones' business plan.

"I like to create context for the wine," says Jones. "Live music, tastings, painting classes, craft fairs, and yoga have all been great ways to introduce people to the winery. Guests aren't here for a lecture, they're here for an experience."

A musician and natural people-person, Jones himself is often part of that experience. He can be found welcoming guests, pouring wine and talking about how it's made, and even getting behind the microphone during the winery's live music events.

"If you are standing at the front door too long, I'm not doing my job," he says.

Looking to the future, Jones is passionate about introducing more wine drinkers to the robust and varied flavors of Pennsylvania made wine. He sees potential in the recent population groundswell in the southern portion of Chester County down into Maryland.

"We are spoiled down here with all of this community support and that so many people are excited to come out for good wine," says Jones. "Pennsylvania wine has a lot to offer, and I'm delighted for more people to discover what we winemakers are creating here."

Family Friendly Recipes from Penn State Extension's Nutrition Links Program



Confetti Rice (Makes 4 servings)

Ingredients

- 2 teaspoons vegetable oil
- 12 mushrooms, sliced
- 2 garlic cloves, minced (2 tsp)
- 2 carrots, peeled and sliced (1 cup)
- Black pepper, to taste
- 1 cup chicken broth
- 1 cup uncooked rice
- 1/2 cup peas

MUSHROOM TIPS



- For the best buy, choose mushrooms that look smooth and dry.
- To prepare fresh mushrooms, rinse under running water. Pat dry with a paper towel if desired. Trim off rough ends of stems.

Directions

1. In a large frying pan, heat oil over medium heat.
2. Add mushrooms and garlic. Cook for 3 minutes, stirring often.
3. Stir in carrots, black pepper, chicken broth, 1 cup water, and rice.
4. Cover, reduce heat to low, and simmer for 20 minutes, until rice is cooked.
5. Stir in peas. Cover and let sit for 5 minutes. Refrigerate leftovers.

- To store fresh mushrooms, place them in a paper bag and refrigerate for up to 5 days.
- Mushrooms contain potassium, which is good for a healthy heart.
- Mushrooms are Chester County's top crop and are grown in indoor mushroom houses year-round.

Strawberry S'mores

(Makes 1 servings)

Ingredients

- 2 strawberries
- 1 graham cracker (broken in half)
- 2 tablespoons of vanilla yogurt

Directions

1. Wash hands with soap and water.
2. Rinse the strawberries in water.
3. Slice the strawberries.
4. Add the yogurt and strawberries to 1/2 of graham cracker.
5. Top with the other 1/2 of graham cracker.
6. Enjoy immediately.

STRAWBERRY TIPS



- Pick the berries after the plants have dried in the morning and keep the picked berries out of direct sunlight.
- Pick when the berries are fully colored, retaining the caps.
- Refrigerate the strawberries as soon as possible.
- Do not wash the berries until just prior to use.
- Strawberries are loaded with vitamin C. Eight strawberries contain 160% of your daily recommended amount.

Meet Geoff Shellington, Chester County Parks + Preservation's Agricultural Programs Coordinator



Farmland is the foundation of Chester County's top industry—agriculture. For over 25 years, Chester County has partnered with farmers and private nonprofit conservation organizations, as well as federal, state, and local government, to permanently preserve over 400 farms. Geoff Shellington leads that effort.

WHAT DREW YOU TO WORKING IN AGRICULTURAL LAND PRESERVATION?

There are so many things that drew me to ag land preservation, but the one that stands out from the rest is the sale of my grandparents' farm. That farm meant the world to our family, but when I was in college it had to be sold. I hated that feeling of loss, but I knew that my family wasn't the only one that has gone through this—and I knew we wouldn't be the last. I am now in the business of keeping farms in families and protecting the agricultural heritage and character of our county, and I couldn't be happier!

WHY DO LANDOWNERS DECIDE TO PURSUE AN AGRICULTURAL EASEMENT?

Over the 15 years I've spent helping farmers preserve their land, I've heard many different reasons why they pursue ag easements. The one that I hear most often is that they want to ensure that their property remains a farm long after they are gone. Farmers have strong ties to their land, so knowing that their farm will always remain a farm is important to them. Another reason folks may pursue an ag easement is for financial compensation: landowners are paid a per-acre easement value that is determined by an appraisal. This financial gain can be put toward an estate, satisfying a mortgage, purchasing additional farming equipment or land, or anything else.

ARE YOU SEEING ANY NEW TRENDS IN AG LAND PRESERVATION?


I'm seeing a steady increase in young next generation farmers. We have worked very hard to focus our efforts on creating large tracts of preserved farmland. The knowledge that these farms are preserved in perpetuity ensures the stability of the infrastructure, as well as the future for our next generation farmers.

This farm owned by James Healy in New London Township was preserved in 2022.
