

Introduction

The Oxford Region Planning Committee Public Kick-off Meeting was held on February 28, 2024, from 6-8pm at the Herr's Visitor's Center.

It included an Open House with multiple information stations and an introduction by ORPC Chair Al Jezyck, Jr. and a presentation by CCPC Senior Planner Mark Gallant followed by a Q&A session.







Several of the area's municipal leaders contacted the Chester County Planning Commission's Executive Director to discuss updating their Comprehensive Plans.

Elk, Upper Oxford, and West Nottingham Townships had completed individual comprehensive plans in 1987, 1982, and 2006, respectively. The other three municipalities relied on the Oxford Region Comprehensive Plan that was adopted in 1969.


2008

Following a meeting with staff from the CCPC in the Winter of 2008, municipal officials from the six municipalities signed a VPP contract with Chester County to partially fund the development of a multimunicipal comprehensive plan. Staff from the Chester County Planning Commission were assigned to work with the group.

The Vision Partnership Program (VPP) is available to Chester County municipalities and multi-municipal groups seeking to improve their planning programs while achieving consistency with and implementation of the goals, objectives, recommendations, and map of Landscapes3, the County Comprehensive Plan.











Major Takeaways from the Implementation Agreement

Responsibilities of the ORPC:

- · Review of and updates to the multimunicipal plan.
- Advisory reviews of developments of regional significance and impact.
- Consistency reviews of proposed municipal zoning and subdivision and land development ordinance amendments when such amendments affect use or density.


Since 2014


Five of the six communities in the Region relied on the Multimunicipal Comprehensive Plan for policies that guide decisions in their communities

Time to Update the Plan




The 2012 Plan included over 300 plan recommendations

The Plan update will include only those plan recommendations that can be implemented during the 10-year horizon of the Plan, eliminating the need for a long wish list.



Existing Land Use Comparison









Results of the Mini-Survey

The Mini-Survey asked the respondent to indicate the top three topics/issues that you think will impact the Oxford Region in the next ten (10) years. The top three (3) answers based on number of responses are:



- 2. Preservation of Rural Character
- 3. Traffic Congestion





East Nottingham Township had the highest percentage (31%) of responses followed by Elk (19%), West Nottingham (14%), Oxford Borough and Lower Oxford at (12%), and Upper Oxford (4%).


