A linear, off-road facility with a permanent alignment that is open to the general public and is designed, constructed, and maintained for use of a variety of non-motorized forms of travel











Shared Roadway

913 responses



Survey Results

- **58%** use trails at least once a week
- 39% travel 2-5 miles, 39% travel over 5 miles to get to a trail
- 82% typically drive to get to trails
- 77% would be somewhat or very likely to use a trail instead of a vehicle for transportation if they connected to where you wanted to go
- **87%** agree or strongly agree that they would like to see more multiuse trails in Chester County

Survey Results

Top 3 reasons for using trails in Chester County

- 1. Health/Fitness
- 2. Recreation
- 3. To observe or be in nature

Top 3 most important factors when deciding to use a trail

- 1. Proximity to where I live
- 2. Trail scenery or environment
- 3. Being able to park my car safely and securely at a trail

Survey Results

Top 3 factors that respondents said would increase trail use

- More trails closer to where I live
- More trails that connect to where I want to go
- Being able to park my car safely and securely at a trail

- County, State, and local parks



- Connections to Historic/Cultural Resources
- Circuit Trail
- Design Standard
